

# CAMP School-Year Programs 2021-22

## COVID-19 Policies and Procedures

Please understand that given the dynamic nature of this pandemic, this information may be modified as the situation evolves, and new data becomes available.

The purpose of this policy is to create an environment that allows CAMP to operate during the pandemic. This document outlines the practical applications of prevention strategies to mitigate the spread of infection and allow for more rapid identification of suspected or confirmed cases of COVID-19 and its variants. During this pandemic, the following policies and procedures will be used to ensure compliance and best practice recommendations outlined by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the American Camp Association (ACA), the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA), and the Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS), are upheld by Campers, Staff, and Volunteers (hereinafter the "Participant" or "Participants," if not otherwise specifically stated).

### **Before all 2021-2022 Programs**

Due to the continued increase in COVID-19 positivity rates and the new Delta variant, CAMP will continue to follow the policies and procedures implemented during the 2021 summer season. The following criteria applies to all Participants who attend any of the CAMP School-Year programs.

- CAMP is currently unable to accept Campers who require overnight (i.e., 24-hour awake) medical care and/or have severe behavioral challenges/care needs.
  - Camper applicants must have NO HISTORY within the past 2 years of...
    - Harm to self or others that may require physical intervention (e.g., restraint) by a caregiver/teacher/counselor etc...
      - *Physical intervention would break the social distancing guideline. Staff members who specialize in these interventions are not assigned to a specific cohort/Tribe, therefore intervention would increase risk of spread between cohorts/Tribes.*
    - Physically aggressive behaviors (e.g., biting, self-harm, hair-pulling, hitting, kicking, property damage)
      - *These behaviors could also require physical intervention that would break the social distancing guideline and allow increased risk of spread between cohorts/Tribes (as outlined above).*
- CAMP will observe the [conditions outlined by the CDC](#) that are at increased risk of severe illness from the virus that causes COVID-19 when determining eligibility for all Participants.
  - CAMP acknowledges COVID-19 is a new disease and the increased risk conditions defined by the CDC are modified as more information becomes available.
  - Increased Risk Conditions:
    - Cancer
    - Chronic kidney disease
    - Chronic lung diseases, including COPD (chronic obstructive pulmonary disease), Asthma (moderate to severe), interstitial lung disease, cystic fibrosis, and pulmonary hypertension
    - Dementia or other neurological conditions
    - Diabetes (type 1 or type 2)
    - Down syndrome
    - Heart conditions such as heart failure, coronary artery disease,

- cardiomyopathies, or hypertension
    - HIV infection
    - Immunocompromised state (weakened immune system) [Types of Primary Immune Deficiency Diseases | NIH: National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases](#)
    - Liver disease
    - Overweight (defined as a body mass index (BMI) > 25 kg/m<sup>2</sup> but < 30 kg/m<sup>2</sup>)
    - Obesity (body mass index [BMI] of 30 kg/m<sup>2</sup> or higher but < 40 kg/m<sup>2</sup>)
    - Severe Obesity (BMI ≥ 40 kg/m<sup>2</sup>)
    - Pregnancy
    - Sickle cell disease
    - Smoking
    - Solid organ or blood stem cell transplant
    - Stroke or cerebrovascular disease, which affects blood flow to the brain
    - Substance use disorders
  - It is the responsibility of each Participant or Caregiver to familiarize themselves with the above CDC criteria.
- Vaccination Status:
  - CAMP strongly encourages vaccination for all eligible Participants attending CAMP programs.
  - If a Participant has any of the determined increased risk conditions and will not receive the COVID-19 vaccine, they will be ineligible to enroll and attend in-person events.
  - If a Participant has any of the determined increased risk conditions and will receive the complete COVID-19 vaccine prior to attendance, their application will be eligible for medical review and consideration.
  - All vaccinated Participants will be required to show proof of vaccination.
- COVID Testing Requirements:
  - All Participants will be required to have a negative COVID-19 test result obtained within 72 hours before arriving to any School-Year program. This includes all staff and volunteers who attend multiple events within a one-month period.
  - **A hard copy of the result must be provided at check-in prior to each program.**
  - CDC does not recommend getting tested again in the 3 months following a positive viral test if the person does not have symptoms of COVID-19. Participants who have had a positive viral test in the 3 months prior to starting camp and have met the criteria to end isolation must provide a letter from their healthcare provider documenting the positive test date and stating the individual is cleared to end isolation.
  - Unvaccinated Participants should engage in a 2-week prearrival quarantine that includes physical distancing, mask-wearing when not at home, avoiding unnecessary travel, and refraining from indoor social gatherings with people outside of their households.
- Campers, their families, staff, and volunteers should refer to [CDC's Travel During COVID-19 guidelines](#) for more details about preparing to travel, including recommendations about staying safe during travel such as wearing a mask in public settings.

**\*\*The following procedures apply to the programs hosted at our Camp CAMP facility. For off-site programs, CAMP will adhere to the policies and procedures set in place by the venue and will provide more information to Participants in the confirmation email prior to the event.\*\***

### **Arrival at Camp CAMP**

- Masks are required during check-in and check-out while parents, caregivers, and others are present, **unless any person with a medical condition or disability prevents them from wearing a face covering.**
- Masks are not required during the program when inside each cohort (tribe grouping) or at outdoor activities, unless participating in “high risk” activities where social distancing is difficult or not feasible.
  - High risk activities are defined as activities where two people who are intermingling outside their cohorts and cannot social distance as define by the CDC. Examples: hand-over-hand activities, medication administration, feeding, transferring, etc.

### **Participant Screening**

Participants will be required to complete CAMP's Access Pass screening and bring the resulting Access Pass (electronic or paper) with them for check-in. If there has been any potentially contagious illness or COVID-19 in the household 10 days prior to camp, do not come, and contact CAMP Staff immediately.

- The protocols listed below are intended to be a minimum standard but may not be exhaustive. The immune status, risk factors, and acuity of specific Participants should be taken into consideration when implementing the specific protocols. At a minimum, any Participant who has a temperature greater than or equal to 100.0° Fahrenheit, or other signs of illness, will not be allowed into Camp CAMP (hereinafter “Facility”) located at 515 Skyline Drive in Center Point, Texas. Participants should educate themselves to be on alert for signs of illness in themselves and anyone in their household. If a Participant (or anyone in their household) exhibits any of the symptoms identified for screening (see below), the Participant(s) will NOT be permitted to enter the facility.

. The policies below are in addition to the standards already in place.

#### **A. Arrival Expectations**

- The following expectations apply to all Participants:
  - All Participants and family members in the vehicle must be prepared with face coverings upon arrival. The only allowable exception is any person with a medical condition or disability that prevents wearing a face covering.
  - All Participants are expected to bring their own masks.
  - Only essential individuals (i.e., Participants expecting to remain at Camp CAMP throughout the event, and one parent/guardian/caregiver with each Camper to assist with check-in) should come to the check-in area to avoid crowding, and anyone who is providing a ride to another individual and not staying for the event or not assisting their camper with check-in should remain in their vehicle.
  - Hand sanitizer will be used upon arrival by all Participants at CAMP events.
  - Participants will practice social distancing, as defined by the CDC, from one another during the arrival and check-in process, if able.
  - All Participants must be prepared to provide a hard copy of their negative COVID test result upon check-in.

## **B. Arrival Screening**

- When Participants arrive, CAMP will verify and collect screening documentation for all individuals in the vehicle prior to allowing entrance into the facility. All individuals in the vehicle must show their completed All Access Pass screening to verify that all responses to the following were “no”:
  - Fever greater than or equal to 100.0° Fahrenheit
  - Chills
  - Cough
  - Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
  - Fatigue
  - Muscle or body aches
  - Headache
  - New loss of taste or smell
  - Sore throat
  - Congestion or runny nose
  - Nausea or vomiting
  - Diarrhea
  - Participant has not been in recent close contact with a confirmed COVID-19 case

## **While at Camp CAMP**

Participants will remain as a half-tribe/cohort upon arrival and throughout the duration of the program. A tribe/cohort will consist of pre-assigned individuals who will participate as a small group for the duration of the program. Once at camp, Participants will be required to stay with their tribe/cohort and not interact with other tribes/cohorts at camp to reduce the chance of spreading COVID-19.

### **A. Ongoing Screening**

- Daily symptom reviews and temperature checks will be performed by designated CAMP staff for all Participants. Ongoing screening will be documented.

### **B. Occurrence of Positive Test Result or Active Symptoms of Contagious Illness while at CAMP**

- If any Participant shows signs of any illness while at CAMP programs, regardless of COVID test result, they will be isolated immediately.
- The parents of any Camper or minor Staff or Volunteer will be contacted immediately and asked to pick up the Participant and take them home as soon as possible. If the parents are not available for pick up, the emergency contact will be required to come get the Participant. Any Participant showing symptoms will be required to wear a medical grade mask (masks and social distancing should already be standard practice even without a positive screening/demonstration of symptoms). CAMP will supply a medical grade mask for Participant(s) who have screened positive or are showing active symptoms if needed.
- If a Staff or Volunteer is showing symptoms and has their own transportation, they should return to their cabin, pack their belongings, and leave Camp CAMP if feeling well enough to safely drive themselves, or have another friend or family member come pick them up if needed; If waiting for a ride, they may be instructed to move out of their assigned cabin to an area where they can be isolated until a ride is available.
- Any Participant screened positive or showing active symptoms will also be asked to identify all other Participants with whom they have come into contact to facilitate onsite contact tracing as necessary.

- Once any Participant screened positive or showing active symptoms has isolated from any public/common spaces at Camp CAMP, cleaning and disinfecting procedures as outlined in this document will be followed by CAMP Staff.
- CAMP will conduct a BinaxNOW COVID-19 Rapid Test onsite, if results are inconclusive then CAMP will direct the Participant to the nearest clinic to obtain a COVID-19 test.
- Participants will be directed to remain in quarantine/self-isolation until test results are received.
- If 3 or more tribes have had any identified positive cases of COVID-19, CAMP will work with state or local public health authorities, as applicable, regarding continued operations of the camp program.
- CAMP will follow CDC guidelines for any Participant who tests positive for COVID-19 during or after an event. These guidelines may include, but are not limited to, notifying the health department of a positive case, identifying what individuals the Participant who tested positive may have been in contact with while at Camp CAMP, informing anyone in our community with potential exposure within 12 hours of the confirmed case while maintaining confidentiality, and ensuring all the following criteria are met before allowing the individual to participate in another CAMP event:
  - At least 72 hours have passed since recovery (resolution of fever without the use of medication).
  - Significant improvement in symptoms.
  - At least 10 days have passed since symptoms first appeared.
- If any unvaccinated Participant has potentially been exposed to an individual who has tested positive, they will be directed to self-isolate at home for 10 days, monitoring symptoms during that time period to include twice daily temperature checks, and to seek medical assistance if they develop symptoms that become severe.
- In the event a Staff member who has symptoms that could be COVID-19 does not get evaluated by a medical professional or tested for COVID-19, the individual is assumed to have COVID-19 - and may not return to work until the individual has completed the same three-step criteria listed above; or –
- If the Staff member has symptoms that could be COVID-19 and wants to return to work before completing the above self-isolation period, the individual must obtain a medical professional’s note clearing the individual for return based on a negative COVID-19 test and an alternative diagnosis.

### **Ongoing Expectations of Participants**

All Participants will be expected to follow the CDC precautions to protect themselves and others while participating in CAMP programs.

- Participants will wash hands frequently using soap and water or an alcohol-based hand rub.
- Participants will cover mouth and nose with flexed elbow or tissue when coughing or sneezing and dispose of used tissue immediately.
- Participants will avoid close contact, if able, with anyone who has cold or flu-like symptoms.
- Participants and CAMP Staff will regularly clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces like phones, doorknobs, light switches, and countertops.
- Participants will seek medical care early if they have a fever, cough, or difficulty breathing.

## **Ongoing Expectations of Staff and Volunteers**

- **All Participants (vaccinated and unvaccinated)**
  - Staff will stay within their cohort unless their job description precludes it.
  - Masks must be worn when outside their cohorts.
  - Masks must be worn while participating in indoor programming.
  - Masks will be required when participating in high-risk activities, such as intermingling with Participants outside their cohorts.
  - Masks are not required outdoors if following social distance guidelines outlined by the CDC, unless participating in high-risk activities.
  - All staff and volunteers may not leave throughout the duration of the program.
  - Be mindful to protect yourself and others between programs (especially if not vaccinated):
    - Wear a mask when required.
    - Social distance when required.
    - Avoid crowds and poorly ventilated spaces.
    - Wash your hands often.

### **Washing Hands and Hand Sanitizer**

Signs encouraging active handwashing along with readily available and strategically placed hand sanitizer stations will be available to use throughout Camp CAMP. CAMP Staff will STRONGLY encourage handwashing and use of sanitizer throughout the day for all Participants.

### **Visitors/Donors/Tours**

- Visits must be pre-arranged prior to arrival.
- All visitors will be required to complete a COVID-19 test prior to arrival and must show proof of vaccination, if applicable.
  - If proof cannot be provided, CAMP staff will conduct a BinaxNOW COVID-19 Rapid Test onsite.
- Visitors will be required to be screened upon arrival.
- Visitors will be required to wear masks and adhere to social distancing as defined by the CDC.

### **Kitchen and Food Service**

**Masks will be worn by all Staff and Volunteers, and encouraged for all Campers, at all times unless seated at their assigned table.**

#### **Utensils and Plates**

- Dining Hall plates, utensils, cups, serving platters, and other various dishes may be used, and will be appropriately cleaned and disinfected between uses.

#### **Food Preparation and Meal Service**

- All Participants must wash their hands prior to preparing or serving a meal.
- CAMP will follow all applicable Federal, State, and Local regulations and guidance related to safe preparation of food.

## **Food Safety and Meal Service Modifications**

- Doors for entry and exit of the Dining Hall, and guidelines for traffic flow throughout the Dining Hall, will be designated.
- Tables will be assigned to each half-tribe and each half-tribe will be required to eat at the same table for the duration of the program.
  - CAMP will arrange tables and chairs to allow for proper social distancing between each half-tribe.
- Tables, benches, and chairs will be washed and sanitized between uses.
- Thorough hand washing (20 seconds with warm water and soap) for all Participants will be required before and after eating.
- There will be no self-service options or buffet-style food offerings (such as a salad bar) due to high risk of contamination.
- All individuals serving food will be required to wear a face covering and gloves while serving.
- Food will be served family-style at the table:
  - A CAMP staff member (hereafter, “Server”) will deliver trays of food to each table.
  - Servers will wear masks and gloves at all times while serving.
  - When a Server provides refills of food or beverages for family-style meals, new dishes will be provided each time.
  - Special diet items for all Participants with food allergies/special diets will be served to them at their designated table.
  - Half-tribe/cohorts will be oriented on the system used to indicate to their Server that they need food/drink refills or general assistance during their first meal at CampCAMP.
  - Only designated Servers will be allowed to touch/use the beverage or cereal dispensers and will wear gloves/follow sanitizing guidelines according to their training; Other Participants will not touch/use the beverage or cereal dispensers.
  - Participants will be asked to remain seated at their respective table unless entering or exiting the Dining Hall or visiting the restrooms. All needed items will be brought to the tables by a Server.
  - At the end of the meal, Tribes will leave all dishes, utensils, etc., on their table and their Server will clear them.
  - Servers should wash their hands after removing their gloves or after directly handling used food service items.
- All non-disposable food service items will be cleaned and sanitized in a commercial dishwasher; CAMP Staff will ensure mechanical dishwashers are functional with the appropriate type and amount of sanitizer and appropriate temperature for sanitizing utensils and food contact surfaces.
- Participants will be issued water bottles that may be filled at their cabins (CAMP will provide a cooler of ice water for their cabin) or at water bottle filling stations throughout the event; Other drinks will be available during meals from Servers.

## **Cleaning and Disinfecting**

The cabins and all buildings will be cleaned and sanitized prior to arrival of Participants. Participants should inform CAMP Staff if any housekeeping is needed over the course of the programs.

Areas prone to high use or touch, such as bathrooms, doors/doorknobs, light switches, sink faucets, countertops, and tables, will be disinfected multiple times daily and after each scheduled use. Disinfecting wipes will also be provided in each public restroom area, and wipes should be thrown away after use. Flushing them causes problems with our wastewater system. Whenever possible, we encourage Participants to return to their assigned cabin to use the restroom, thus minimizing their exposure to viruses that could be transferred through public restroom use. Participants should alert CAMP staff if there is a bathroom or other location that needs immediate cleaning/sanitizing attention.

Staff and Volunteers will wear disposable gloves and approved PPE while performing all cleaning tasks, including handling trash. Staff and Volunteers should immediately report breaches in PPE such as a tear in gloves or any other potential exposures to their supervisor. Staff and Volunteers will be expected to wash their hands thoroughly and often, including immediately after removing gloves and/or after contact with an ill person.

- Gloves will be compatible with the disinfectant products being used to prevent tears or deterioration. Only **latex-free** gloves are allowed on CAMP property.
- Additional PPE may be required based on (a) the cleaning/disinfectant products being used, (b) the risk of splash, or (c) in response to potential biohazards.
- Gloves should be removed carefully to avoid contamination of the wearer and the surrounding area; All staff are expected to wash hands thoroughly after removing gloves.
- Reusable (washable) clothing or cleaning materials should be laundered after each use; All Staff and Volunteers are expected to wash hands thoroughly after handling dirty laundry.

All Participants should follow normal preventive actions while at CAMP and after returning to home and/or work, including washing hands, and/or using hand sanitizer regularly, and avoiding touching eyes, nose, or mouth with unwashed hands.

#### **Cleaning of Hard (Non-porous) Surfaces**

- Hard surfaces that are dirty should be cleaned using a detergent or soap and water prior to disinfection (See “Disinfecting” below for next steps).

#### **Cleaning of Soft (Porous) Surfaces**

- Soft (porous) surfaces, such as carpeted floors, rugs, and drapes, should have visible contamination removed if present and then cleaned with appropriate cleaners indicated for use on these surfaces. After cleaning:
  - If the items can be laundered, they should be laundered using the warmest appropriate water setting for the items and dried completely.
  - Otherwise, use products that are EPA-approved and that are suitable for porous surfaces.
  - Use appropriate disinfectants (see “Disinfecting” below) as applicable.

#### **Linens, Clothing, and Other Items That Go in the Laundry**

- To minimize the possibility of dispersing viruses through the air, dirty laundry should not be shaken.
- Items should be washed as appropriate in accordance with the manufacturer’s instructions; If possible, items should be laundered using the warmest appropriate water setting for the items and dried completely.
- Hampers or other carts for transporting laundry should be cleaned and then disinfected according to guidance above for hard or soft surfaces and below for disinfecting.

### **Disinfecting**

- CAMP will provide EPA-registered household disinfectants proven effective at killing the SARS-COV-2 virus; Participants authorized to use them will follow the instructions on the label or provided during their training by CAMP Staff.
- All solutions and disinfectants will be applied according to the manufacturer's recommendations.
- Alcohol solutions with at least 70% alcohol may also be used, including alcohol wipes.

### **Cleaning and Disinfection After Persons Suspected/Confirmed to Have COVID-19 Have Been in the Facility**

If it has been more than 7 days since a Participant with suspected/confirmed COVID-19 visited or used the Facility, additional cleaning and disinfection is not necessary. If it has been less than 7 days since such a person visited or used Camp CAMP, then:

- Follow CDC Guidance for Summer and Youth Camps: <https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/community/schools-childcare/summer-camps.html>.
- Areas visited by anyone who was ill will be closed off until after cleaning and disinfecting them (including cleaning and disinfecting surfaces or shared objects in outdoor areas).
- If feasible, outside doors and windows should be opened, and/or the use of ventilating fans to increase air circulation in the area should be used, prior to and during cleaning.
- If feasible, CAMP Staff will wait at least 24 hours before cleaning and disinfecting. If 24 hours is not feasible, CAMP Staff will wait as long as possible, and then proceed with cleaning and disinfection as outlined above using all recommended Personal Protective Equipment (PPE).
- If a cabin or other area is not needed for use, CAMP Staff will wait at least 7 days, and then perform routine cleaning and disinfecting procedures.

## **Camp CAMP Activities**

### **COVID-19 Policies and Procedures**

Activities will be designed to keep Participants socially distant as much as possible. Sharing of materials such as craft and athletic supplies will be kept to a minimum. If sharing of supplies is needed, staff will sanitize the item between use. Outdoor activities will be prioritized to ensure campers are in maximum ventilation for the majority of the day. While participating in indoor activities, staff will attempt to maximize general ventilation by utilizing window and door openings.

#### **Specific Program Area Protocols**

##### **Arts and Crafts:**

- Camper Safety Protocols:
  - All Campers must wear masks when outside their cohorts, if able.
  - All Campers must hand sanitize before and after use of the Arts and Crafts area.
  - Campers must stay socially distanced from other Participants not in their assigned half-tribe/cohort.
  - Campers will be assigned a designated space at the Arts and Crafts Center and expected to stay in that space.
  - Campers must use only the supplies and equipment provided by CAMP/from their assigned bin for entire program.
  - Campers should ask the Staff and Volunteers for additional supplies as needed.
  - Campers are encouraged to return to their assigned cabins to use the restroom if at all possible; if use of a restroom is necessary during a visit to the Arts & Crafts Center, Staff should be notified to ensure disinfection prior to new tribe/cohort/next program.
- Staff Safety Protocols:
  - The Head Instructor must wear a mask at all times when interacting with tribes/cohorts.
  - Staff and Volunteers must wear masks at all times when outside their cohorts.
  - Staff and Volunteers must maintain social distance as much as possible.
  - Staff and Volunteers must sanitize hands frequently.
  - Staff and Volunteers must sanitize all used equipment prior to each use.
  - Arts & Crafts Instructors will be the only ones allowed to gather or replace materials (such as paint).
- Cleaning Procedures:
  - Staff will use an electrostatic fogger to disinfect the entire area, including bathrooms.
  - Staff will clean and disinfect any common supplies or equipment used for that program (i.e., that did not come from/return to the half-tribe/cohort's assigned bin) prior to each use.
  - Common supplies or equipment will be placed in a "Used" bin after program for cleaning.
  - Staff will clean and disinfect all tables before and after each program.
  - Staff will clean and disinfect all sinks and countertops before and after each program.
  - Staff will clean and disinfect any spaces that Participants will come in contact with before and after each program.
  - Staff will clean and disinfect all entrance and exit handles.
- Supplies/Equipment Needed
  - Hand Sanitizer
  - Gloves
  - Sanitizing Wipes
  - Appropriate disinfectant solution

- Masks
- Cleaning Towels
- Instructional Signs
- Standard Arts & Crafts supplies and equipment needed for planned projects.

**Aquatic Center (Pools/Splash Pad):**

- Camper Safety Protocols:
  - Campers will be separated at the pool or have different swim times.
  - Campers are encouraged to change before and after visiting the Aquatic Center in their assigned cabin.
  - All Campers must use hand sanitizer before and after use of the pool area.
  - Campers must stay socially distanced from other Participants not in their half-tribe/cohort and Lifeguards at all times (except during a lifesaving event).
  - No pool toys will be provided by CAMP for any reason with the exception of a Personal Floatation Device (PFD) or Inner Tube for the Slow River (Lifeguards will clean and disinfect these after each half-tribe/cohort's use).
  - Campers should enter and exit through appropriate gates.
  - Restrooms at the Aquatic Center should only be used if absolutely necessary, and each half-tribe/cohort will be assigned a restroom to use by the Lifeguards.
    - Campers are encouraged to return to their assigned cabins to use the restroom if at all possible.
    - If use of a restroom is necessary during a half-tribe/cohort's visit to the Aquatic Center, Lifeguards should be notified to ensure they clean and disinfect prior to the next half-tribe/cohort's visit.
- Staff Safety Protocols
  - Staff and Volunteers must wear masks when outside their cohorts, except while in a pool or outside activity.
  - Staff and Volunteers must maintain social distance as much as possible.
  - Staff and Volunteers must hand sanitize frequently.
  - Staff and Volunteers must sanitize all used equipment before and after use.
  - Lifeguards are the only individuals allowed in the Lifeguard Office or Equipment Storage Room.
  - Lifeguards are not required to wear mask unless participating in a high-risk activity.
- Cleaning Procedures
  - Lifeguards will use an electrostatic fogger to disinfect the bathrooms.
  - Lifeguards will clean and disinfect gate or door entry and exit handles between programs.
  - Lifeguards will clean and disinfect any communal spaces between programs.
  - Lifeguards will clean and disinfect any chairs/benches used during program between programs (following procedures for Porous or Non-Porous Surfaces outlined above).
  - Lifeguards will clean and disinfect any equipment used during the program.
    - PFDs
    - Inner Tubes
- Supplies/Equipment Needed:
  - Hand Sanitizer
  - Gloves
  - Sanitizing Wipes
  - Appropriate disinfectant solution
  - Masks

**CAMPfire:**

- Camper Safety Protocols:
  - Masks are not required at outside activities if half-tribe/cohort is practicing social distancing.
  - All Campers must hand sanitize before and after use of Campfire equipment.
  - Campers will be called one half-tribe/cohort at a time for a turn to make S'mores by CAMP Staff.
- Staff Safety Protocols:
  - If vaccinated, the outdoor cooking instructor will not be required to wear a mask, unless participating in high-risk activities.
  - If unvaccinated, the outdoor cooking instructor will be required to wear a mask if they are unable to adhere to CDC social distancing guidelines.
  - Staff and Volunteers are not required to wear masks at outside activities if the half-tribe/cohort is practicing social distancing.
  - Staff and Volunteers must maintain social distance as much as possible.
  - Staff and Volunteers must sanitize hands and change gloves frequently.
  - Staff and Volunteers must sanitize all used equipment prior to each half-tribe/cohort's use.
- Cleaning Procedures:
  - Staff will clean and disinfect any equipment used for program and prior to each half-tribe/cohort's use.
  - Any unused supplies (food) will be disposed of if not consumed.
- Supplies:
  - Hand Sanitizer
  - Gloves
  - Sanitizing Wipes
  - Appropriate disinfectant solution
  - Masks
  - Cleaning Towels
  - Instructional Signs
  - Standard CAMPfire supplies and safety equipment

**Canoeing:**

- Camper Safety Protocols:
  - Masks are not required at outside activities if the half-tribe/cohort is practicing social distancing.
  - All Campers must hand sanitize before and after use of the canoeing area.
  - Campers must stay socially distanced from other half-tribes/cohorts while waiting to load and unload canoes.
- Staff Safety Protocols:
  - If vaccinated, instructors and lifeguards will not be required to wear a mask, unless participating in high-risk activities.
  - If unvaccinated, instructors and lifeguards will be required to wear a mask if they are unable to adhere to CDC social distancing guidelines.

- Staff and Volunteers are not required to wear masks at outside activities if the tribe/cohort is practicing social distancing.
- Staff and Volunteers must maintain social distance as much as possible.
- Staff and Volunteers must sanitize hands frequently.
- Staff must sanitize all used equipment prior to each use.
- **Cleaning Procedures:**
  - Staff and Volunteers will clean and disinfect each canoe prior to each new half-tribe/cohort's use.
  - Staff and Volunteers will clean and disinfect gate handles between each half-tribe's use.
  - Once PFDs are used, they will be placed on the gate/fence designed for used PFDs.
    - Staff will clean and disinfect all PFDs with appropriate disinfectant solution or electrostatic spray prior to each use.
    - If possible, PFDs will only be used by 1 Participant during each scheduled activity period.

#### **Horseback:**

- **Camper Safety Protocols:**
  - Masks are not required at outside activities if half-tribe/cohort is practicing social distancing.
  - All Campers must hand sanitize before and after use of the horseback area.
  - Campers must stay socially distanced from other half-tribe/cohorts while waiting to load and unload onto horses.
- **Staff Safety Protocols:**
  - If vaccinated, horseback instructors will not be required to wear a mask, unless participating in high-risk activities.
  - If unvaccinated, instructors will be required to wear a mask if they are unable to adhere to CDC social distancing guidelines.
  - Staff and Volunteers must wear masks when outside their cohort.
  - Staff and Volunteers must maintain social distance as much as possible.
  - Staff and Volunteers must sanitize hands frequently.
  - Staff and Volunteers must sanitize all used equipment prior to each use.
- **Cleaning Procedures:**
  - Helmets, tack, and other items touched by any Participant will be cleaned and disinfected between use using the designated cleaner and protocols.
- **Supplies/Equipment Needed:**
  - Hand Sanitizer
  - Tack Sanitizer
  - Gloves
  - Sanitizing Wipes
  - Appropriate disinfectant solution

- Masks
- Cleaning Towels
- Instructional Signs
- Standard Horseback supplies and equipment

**Nature:**

- Camper Safety Protocols:
  - Masks are not required at outside activities if the half-tribe/cohort is practicing social distancing.
  - All Campers must hand sanitize before and after use of the area or handling of animals.
  - Campers must stay socially distanced from other half-tribe/cohorts while inside Nature Center.
- Staff Safety Protocols:
  - Nature Instructor will be required to wear a mask while indoors.
  - Staff and Volunteers must wear masks when outside their cohort.
  - Staff and Volunteers must maintain social distance as much as possible.
  - Staff and Volunteers must sanitize hands frequently.
  - Staff and Volunteers must sanitize all used equipment prior to each use.
- Cleaning Procedures:
  - Staff will use an electrostatic fogger to disinfect the interior of the Nature Center.
  - Cages, equipment, or other surfaces touched by any Participant will be disinfected between use.
- Supplies:
  - Hand Sanitizer
  - Gloves
  - Sanitizing Wipes
  - Appropriate disinfectant solution
  - Masks
  - Cleaning Towels
  - Instructional Signs
  - Standard Nature supplies and equipment

**Outdoor Cooking:**

- Camper Safety Protocols:
  - Masks are not required at outside activities if half-tribe/cohort is practicing social distancing.
  - All Campers must hand sanitize before and after use of the area or handling equipment.
  - Campers must stay socially distanced from other half-tribe/cohorts when participating in outdoor cooking.
  - Each Camper will consume only the item(s) that they make during Outdoor Cooking.
- Staff Safety Protocols:
  - If vaccinated, outdoor cooking instructors will not be required to wear a mask, unless participating in high-risk activities.
  - If unvaccinated, outdoor cooking instructors will be required to wear a mask if they are unable to adhere to CDC social distancing guidelines.
  - Staff and Volunteers must maintain social distance as much as possible.
  - Staff and Volunteers must wear masks when outside their cohort.
  - Staff and Volunteers must hand sanitize frequently.

- Staff and Volunteers must sanitize all used equipment prior to each use.
- Only Outdoor Cooking Instructor will handle food that will be distributed to Participants and will do so wearing gloves.
- All serving items and utensils will be disposable.
- If the outdoor cooking instructor is vaccinated, he/she will not be required to wear a mask unless participating in high-risk activities.
- Cleaning Procedures:
  - Staff will clean and disinfect all used outdoor cooking equipment.
  - Any unused supplies (food) will be disposed of if not consumed.
- Supplies/Equipment Needed:
  - Hand Sanitizer
  - Gloves
  - Sanitizing Wipes
  - Appropriate disinfectant solution
  - Masks
  - Cleaning Towels
  - Instructional Signs
  - Standard Outdoor Cooking supplies and safety equipment

#### **Sports & Recreation (Lawn Games) and Gaga Ball:**

- Camper Safety Protocols:
  - Masks are not required at outside activities if half-tribe/cohort is practicing social distancing.
  - All Campers must hand sanitize before and after use of the area or handling equipment.
  - Campers must hand sanitize before and after use of the Sports & Recreation area or Gaga Ball Pit.
  - Campers will play sports only within their half-tribe/cohort.
  - Campers must use the same equipment for entire scheduled activity period.
- Staff Safety Protocols:
  - If vaccinated, Sports and Recreation instructors will not be required to wear a mask, unless participating in high-risk activities.
  - If unvaccinated, Sports and Recreation instructors will be required to wear a mask if they are unable to adhere to CDC social distancing guidelines.
  - Staff and Volunteers must wear masks when outside their cohort.
  - Staff and Volunteers must maintain social distance as much as possible.
  - Staff and Volunteers must sanitize hands frequently.
    - Staff and Volunteers must sanitize all used equipment before and after use.
- Cleaning Procedures:
  - Staff will clean and disinfect any equipment used for program before and after each program (e.g., kickballs, footballs, soccer balls, gaga balls, frisbees).
  - Equipment will be placed in a “Used Equipment” bin after program for cleaning.
- Supplies/Equipment Needed:
  - Hand Sanitizer
  - Gloves
  - Sanitizing Wipes
  - Appropriate disinfectant solution
  - Masks
  - Cleaning Towels
  - Instructional Signs

- Standard Sports & Recreation or Gaga Ball equipment

### **Target Sports (Archery/Paintball):**

- Camper Safety Protocols:
  - Masks are not required at outside activities if half-tribe/cohort is practicing social distancing.
  - All Campers must hand sanitize before and after use of the area or handling equipment.
  - Only one half-tribe/cohort is allowed per Target Sports program.
- Staff Safety Protocols:
  - If vaccinated, Target Sports instructors will not be required to wear a mask, unless participating in high-risk activities.
  - If unvaccinated, Target Sports instructors will be required to wear a mask if they are unable to adhere to CDC social distancing guidelines.
  - Staff and Volunteers must wear masks when outside their cohort.
  - Staff and Volunteers must maintain social distance as much as possible.
  - Staff and Volunteers must sanitize hands frequently.
  - Staff and Volunteers must sanitize all used equipment before and after use.
  - Staff and Volunteers will preset all equipment for each half-tribe/cohort prior to arrival.
  - Only Staff and Volunteers are allowed in Equipment Storage Rooms.
- Cleaning Procedures:
  - Staff and Volunteers will clean and disinfect all bows, arrows, paintball guns, or safety goggles (that are intended to be reused) prior to each use.
  - Staff and Volunteers will clean and disinfect any additional equipment/hardware prior to each use.
- Supplies/Equipment Needed:
  - Hand Sanitizer
  - Gloves
  - Sanitizing Wipes
  - Appropriate disinfectant solution
  - Masks
  - Cleaning Towels
  - Instructional Signs
  - Standard Target Sports supplies and safety equipment

### **Additional Evening Programs for Staff and Volunteers:**

- Socially distanced night activities may be offered at night for Staff and Volunteers after Campers return to their cabins for the night.
- No matter the activity, the following protocols and procedures apply to evening programs:
  - Staff Safety Protocols:
    - Staff and Volunteers must wear masks at all times if they are not vaccinated.
    - Staff and Volunteers must maintain social distance as much as possible.
    - Staff and Volunteers must sanitize hands frequently.
    - Staff and Volunteers must sanitize all used equipment before and after use.
  - Cleaning Procedures:
    - Staff and Volunteers will clean and disinfect used items or equipment (that are intended to be reused) prior to each use.
